PUBLIC NOTICE OF CHANGE IN RATES UPON APPLICATION
WITHOUT PROPOSED EFFECTIVE DATES
WADESVILLE EXTENSION – LUBECK PUBLIC SERVICE DISTRICT

NOTICE is hereby given that LUBECK PUBLIC SERVICE DISTRICT, a public utility, has on February 23, 2010, filed with the PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION OF WEST VIRGINIA, an application containing increased rates, tolls and charges for furnishing water service to approximately 135 customers at or near Wadesville, in Wood County, West Virginia.

The proposed increased rates and charges will produce approximately \$67,500.00 per year, due to a surcharge of \$3.50 per thousand gallons of water (or fraction of the last thousand) passing through the retail meter of **each customer who are provided treated water service because of the extension of water service to the Wadesville area only. The remaining customers of Lubeck Public Service District will not be subjected to any increase in water service charges under this project.**

There are no known resale customers of Lubeck Public Service District in the area affected by this extension or otherwise affected by the surcharge to be imposed.

The increases shown are based on averages of all customers in the indicated class. Each class may receive an increase or decrease greater or less than stated here. Individual customers may receive increases that are greater or less than average. Furthermore, the requested rates and charges are only a proposal and are subject to change (increases or decreases) by the Public Service Commission in its review of this filing. Any increase in rates and charges will not become effective until authorized and approved by the Commission. (If a hearing is scheduled, notice will be given of the time and place of hearing.)

Anyone desiring to protest or intervene should file a written protest or notice of intervention prior to March 30, 2010, unless otherwise modified by Commission order. Failure to timely protest or intervene can affect your rights to protest any rate increases and to participate in future proceedings. All protests or requests to intervene should briefly state the reason for the protest or intervention. Requests to intervene must comply with the Commission's rule on intervention set forth in the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure.
